"Preserving the Past, Protecting the Future" Tropical Audubon Society Exhibit Wirtz Gallery Opening Night Reception Friday, February 11, 6-8pm



Attend the free opening night reception celebrating an exhibit that showcases Tropical Audubon Society's rich, local history and conservation mission. Our 75-year trajectory will be brought to life via a sweeping photographic essay, together with Audubon prints and works by South Florida wildlife artists at The Wirtz Gallery. The month-long exhibit will illuminate our society's benefactor, South Miami-area pioneer Arden Hayes "Doc" Thomas, the gift of his now-historic home to our organization, and our commitment to protecting South Florida wildlife, and preserving our region's diverse habitats and natural resources. (The opening night reception is subject to postponement or cancellation pending February pandemic status/protocols.)

Located within the First National Bank of South Miami lobby, **The Wirtz Gallery** is a distinguished public art space featuring month-long exhibits by local, national and international artists. It opened in 1983 in memoriam to Arthur M. Wirtz, a past bank chairman of the board and a patron of the Arts. 5750 Sunset Drive, South Miami, 33143.
